



## JOHN HINSHAW, CIO OF BOEING named CIO of the Year for 2009

Chicago, IL - On October 20, 2009 the CIO of the Year award, co-sponsored by The Executives Club of Chicago (ECC) and Association of Information Technology (AITP), was presented to John Hinshaw, CIO at Boeing.

The presentation at the ECC High Tech Conference in Chicago was witnessed by approximately 400 attendees. The nomination process starts in early July each year and 30+ top CIOs are nominated by their CEOs. Those nominated prepare an in depth write-up on themselves covering 12 key areas. Each of their answers are judged by 12 of their peers and given a score from 1 to 10.

The CIOs are judged on the following categories:

- Role in the Business
- Career Background
- Leadership in Driving the Business
- Leadership in Company Success in the Global Economy
- Innovation/Contribution to the Company's Competitiveness
- Leadership in Corporate Social Responsibility
- Actions taken and accomplishments in Building Business Partners
- Vision (Long & Short term)
- Thoroughness and Practicality of Vision
- Relevance to the Business
- Contribution to External Customers
- Organizational Effectiveness
- External Recognition (awards)
- Community and Professional Contributions
